

Apparently a grazier named Richard Smith was running cattle on the banks of the Mary River and at the time his wife was reading the novel Kenilworth. The property was named Kenilworth which then became the name of the town.

Kenilworth is a small rural town in the beautiful upper Mary Valley Country and behind the Blackall Range. It is about 50 kilometers from the coast with dairy farming as the major industry. Well known Kenilworth Cheese has been made in Kenilworth for more than 60 years. Taste the finest cheese, yogurt, mousse and ice cream at the Kenilworth Dairies Cheese Factory. Unfortunately due to Covid 19 there is no cheese tasting at present. Poppa's Cafe on site is currently takeaway only, patrons can eat cafe food at chairs and tables provided and there is seating for approximately 20 people.

Kenilworth Bakery is home to the 1kg Donut Challenge and Australia's first coffee in a donut. Their unique hand-crafted donuts represent the combination of creativity and trade skills that culminates in the purest form of indulgence but unfortunately not for the weight conscious though.

Explore the town to uncover some more unique and quirky hidden gems that most of these small country towns have to offer.

Tourism is a big draw card to the area these days and Kenilworth is doing a great job to encourage tourists to their town.


